Hazardous Waste Day Success!

More than **160 York residents** took part in this year's Hazardous Waste Day at the Witchtrot Road Recycling Facility. Items collected include:

- » Ten 55-gallon drums of solvents and paint pour-off
- » Three 55-gallon drums of inorganic chlorinated oxidizers
- » One 30-gallon drum of inorganic chlorinated oxidizers
- » One 55-gallon drum of assorted acids
- » One 55-gallon drum of assorted base materials
- » One 15-gallon drum of asbestos material
- » 2 cubic yard boxes of expired non-regulated household waste
- » 2 cubic yard boxes of flammable liquids
- » 1 cubic yard box of liquid pesticides
- » 1 cubic vard box of assorted aerosols

Road Paving

Pine Ridge Loop – from Woodside Meadow to cul-de-sac (706 feet) **Chickadee Drive** – from Meadowlark Drive So. To Meadowlark Drive North (1,310 feet)

Egret Circle – from Chickadee Drive to cul-de-sac (559 feet)

Beach Ball Field Road – from Church Street to Bay Street (618 feet)

Barrell Lane Ext – from Barrell Lane to cul-de-sac (909 feet)

Georgia Street - from York Street to dead end (806 feet)

Osprey Lane – Meadowlark Drive to Osprey Lane (2,205 feet)

High Street – from Main Street to Freeman Street (533 feet)

Contractors from StreetScan Services used high-tech cameras and equipment to conduct an extensive evaluation of the streets, sidewalks, crosswalks, ramps and street signs in York.

DPW Battles First Big Storm

Catch Basin Clearing

using specialized, high-pressure

vacuums and hoses to remove leaves,

sticks, and other assorted debris.

DPW crews and equipment were deployed early and in place to help affected areas in the wake of a major storm bringing heavy rain, 50 mph gusts, power outages, and flooding to the area.
