#### **FEMA Declaration**

In Q1, a Federal Disaster Declaration was issued for the State of Maine to help communities recover from Winter Storm Eliot that occurred December 23 - 24, 2022. This Federal Disaster Declaration, DR-4696, authorizes the release of federal funds for York County as it met the minimum cost threshold of damages and will provide Federal and State funds to help the Town of York make repairs to damaged infrastructure.
