CHIP SEAL APPLICATION

DPW and the Town hired All States Materials to apply an innovative road surface treatment called AR Chip Seal on Perkins Court, Perkins Drive, and Old Chases Pond Road in July. This material is an Asphalt-Rubber product that is shown to be durable, versatile, and made of recycled tires that would normally be in landfills – approx. 1,340 tires per mile!



TOUCH-A-TRUCK

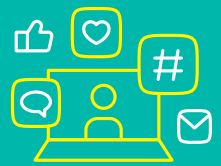
DPW took part in the annual Touch-a-Truck event at the York Public Library in July. We brought a loader, a street sweeper, and a 6-wheeler to the event for kids and families to learn about and see up close.



MOUNTAIN ROAD

The Mountain Road drainage, widening, and resurfacing project was completed in Q3. This project involved rehabilitating and reconstructing the existing road and gravel shoulders on both sides of the road, widening the road surface to include lanes for bicycles and pedestrians, removing and replacing all undersized/ failing road culverts, and cleaning out existing open drainage ditches along the road. Slip form concrete curbs were placed in some areas where needed with final surface pavement placed by the Town's paving contractor.

SALT BID AWARDED

In September, Selectboard members approved the bid submitted by Granite State Materials to provide the road salt York requires to treat roads for the upcoming winter season.

STREETS PAVED

Street paving was well underway in Q3 with complete resurfacing of Meadowlark, Bluestone, Pine Hill South, Norwood Farms Road, Milbury, Roaring Rock Road, Old Seabury, Belmont, and Newport Roads.



CROSSWALK STAMPING

Pattern Paving Service completed crosswalk stamping on Lindsay Road, Moulton Lane, and Nubble Road. They used specialized propane heaters that soften existing asphalt, placed a steel-reinforced template over the heated area, and then used compactors to pound the template down. The result is an attractive, herringbone pattern that provides traction for pedestrians using the crosswalk.
